68. "the more closely the dream state is approximated,
the less it is possible to exert voluntary effort."
Rapp. 24 "the closer the thought to the waking state, the more
verbalized it is; the closer it is to the dream form
the more its medium becomes visual imagery"

69. "As one proceeds from the waking toward the dream forms of thought, one finds that in the waking form the thought is explicit, in the dream form it becomes implicit." (29)

70. Continuous transition between prim. & secondg processes; "it is always a question of more or less." Freud was aware of this. (Interp. of Dreams, Basic Writings, 1964, p. 536. Also: as one progresses toward dream state conjunction tend to fall away
