that our present crisis is inevitable, and potentially disastrous, so long as we continue to prefer quantity (having) to quality (being).

The way back from the brink must depend on a "religious" impetus, be-cause that alone is strong enough to create a new society, and within those inverted commas Dr. Fromm would include what he considers one of the most important new developments of the century—the growing liberation of women. If women can abjure men's power structures and formulate their own, then, hopefully, a better and more sharing society may yet emerge. emerge.

emerge. So a humanist is turned preacher, and provides some interesting twists for the Christian reader. He seeks to change the heart by appealing to the head. With Schumacher he believes that infinite growth cannot fit into a finite world and that for the first time ever we must restrain our eco-nomic and technological advancement (or at least redirect it) in the spirit of necessity. An appeal to reason, not to charity. * * charity. ٠ε.

1 ¥ A Christian Europe Dr. Fromm dis-misses as largely a sham-at least since the sixteeenth century. Jesus-himself is the perfect exemplar of "beng" rather than "having"; but, despite numerous genuinely Christian movements, the character of our modern Western world is greedy and pagan. Dr. Fromm's lament that we are now possessed by machines, are commodities for sale, are alienated from our true selves, reads like a general confession; but it is a humanist one, believing that salvation lies only within ourselves. . : •

lies only within ourselves. This book is a study of concepts rather than empirical events. The analyses are always clear and the tendency to generalise can be provo-cative. One balks for instance, at the Buddha's Four Noble-Truths be coming synonymous with Marx's philosophy, and at the over-simplified categories which seem more con-venient than convincing; yet in these weaknesses lie also Dr. Fromm's strength. His ability to scan horizons and His ability to scan horizons and take the broad view gives a visionary quality to his scholarship which has resulted in seminal works in the past, and provides this book with a stimu-lating argument. In the present flood of prepare-to-avert-thy-doom litera-ture, it should have a significant place.
