we also call it death instinct.
- 148 Eros not " sexual and conservation. — unlike Plato.
- 149 Sexual act = act of aggression with the purpose of the union into male union. ( J. L. Austin's contained.)
- 150 total available energy of Eros = libido.
- 151 libido somatic sources + sexual organs - parts of the body (exogenous energy)
- 152 libido coincides with those according to preexisting need  
- even if not according to our theory.
- 153 anal-sadistic
- 154 satisfaction of death instinct per se, does not give feeling of pleasure.
- 155 libido energies organize themselves in physiol. function selflessly  
purposeful preservation of the race.
- 156 " the psychic is unconscious in itself " - hence pos. = habitual structure
- 157 in somatic processes there is concomitant with the psychic ones  
to repress the essence of what is psychical.:
- 158 " Re processes with which it is concerned are in themselves just as
