#### Lab experiments in batch along reaction co-ordinate

- Data in parallel acquired with high-field and low-field spectrometer
- ",Fast" and "slow loop"
- Li-HMDS was dosed stepwise

## **Indirect Hard Modeling (IHM)**



Modeling peak fitting of pure component spectra  $\rightarrow$  mixture model Analysis "component fitting"  $\rightarrow$  calculation of component area

## Sample Temperature and Signal-to-Noise-Ratio

## 5 mm PTFE tube

- Sample temperature: 28.5 °C
- » SNR: 333

#### 1/16 inch dewar cell

- Sample temperature: 20 60°C
- >> SNR: 8
