Why Linked Open Data (LOD)?

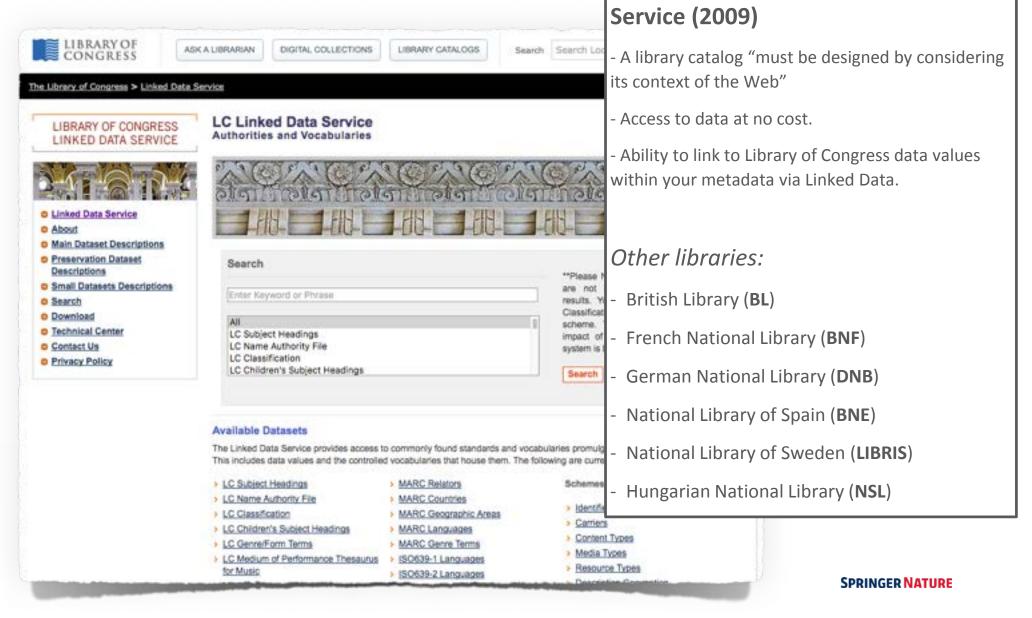
- Make data machine-readable, interoperable, and re-usable

 - Be part of the LOD cloud



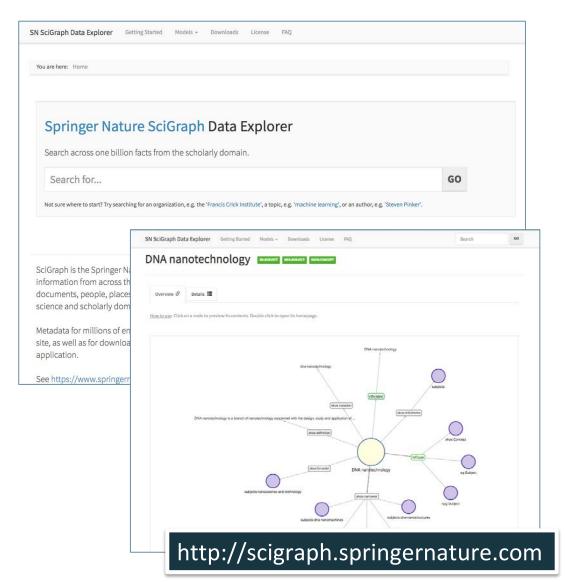

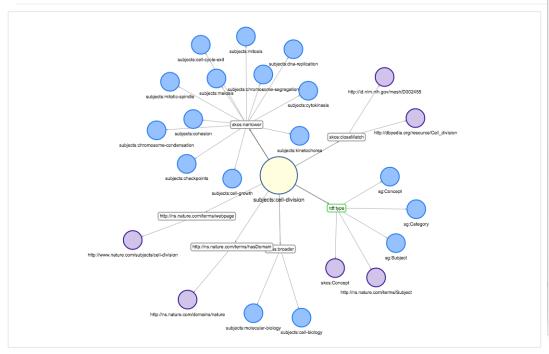

Cell division

Cell division is the process by which a parental cell gives rise to two daughter cells. The process involves both nuclear division and cytokinesis and can either produce two equal cells (symmetric cell division) or two cells with different cellular fates (asymmetric cell division).



Purpose

- simple UI for exploring graph contents interactively
- internal version: unrestricted access to data and statistics
- external version: only public data, allows linked data 'dereferencing'

Features

- text & graphical UI on top of graph database
- one page per URI, permits to download machine readable descriptions of data

Geographical trends in research: a preliminary analysis on authors' affiliations

Abstract. In the last decade, research literature reached an enormous volume with an unprecedented current annual increase of 1.5 million new publications. As research gets ever more global and new countries and institutions, either from academia or corporate environment, start to contribute with their share, it is important to monitor this complex scenario and understand its dynamics.

We present a study on a conference proceedings dataset extracted from Springer Nature Scigraph that illustrates insightful geographical trends and highlights the unbalanced growth of competitive research institutions worldwide. Results emerged from our micro and macro analysis show that the distributions among countries of institutions and papers follow a power law, and thus very few countries keep producing most of the papers accepted by high-tier conferences. In addition, we found that the annual and overall turnover rate of the top 5, 10 and 25 countries is extremely low, suggesting a very static landscape in which new entries struggle to emerge. Finally, we highlight the presence of an increasing gap between the number of institutions initiating and overseeing research endeavours (i.e. first and last authors' affiliations) and the total number of institutions participating in research. As a consequence of our analysis, the paper also discusses our experience in working with affiliations: an utterly simple matter at first glance, that is instead revealed to be a complex research and technical challenge yet far from being solved.

Focus on conference proceedings data in SN SciGraph from 1996 to 2017

Subject:

C-peptide

The connecting peptide, or C-peptide, is a short 31-amino-acid polypeptide that connects insulin's A-chain to its B-chain in the proinsulin molecule. In the insulin synthesis pathway, first preproinsulin is translocated into the endoplasmic reticulum of beta cells of the pancreas with an A-chain, a C-peptide, a B-chain, and a signal sequence. The signal sequence is cleaved from the N-terminus of the peptide by a signal peptidase, leaving proinsulin. After proinsulin is packaged into vesicles in the Golgi apparatus (beta-granules), the C-peptide is removed, leaving the A-chain B-chain, bound together by disulfide bonds, that constitute the insulin molecule.

Abstract Objectives This study is designed to explore the effect of paricalcitol (vitamin D receptor agonist) on pancreatic oxidative stress, inflammatory markers, and adiponectin and glycemic status in diabetic rats. Materials and methodsForty Sprague-Dawley male rats aged 10–12 weeks (150–250 g) were used in this study. Type 2 diabetes was developed by providing 4 weeks of high-fat-diet feeding before one shot of streptozotocin injection (40 mg/kg i₁p.). Four study groups were designed as normal control rats, diabetic control vehicle-treated, diabetic paricalcitol-treated (0.8 μg/kg), and diabetic glibenclamide-treated (0.6 mg/kg) groups with 10 animals in each. After treatment of diabetic rats for 3 months, pancreatic inflammatory and oxidative stress markers, plasma adiponectin, glycemic status parameters, and histopathological pancreatic islet changes were evaluated. ResultsParicalcitol and glibenclamide treatment significantly (P < 0.05) decreased plasma glucose, insulin resistance, and pancreatic malondialdehyde and tumor necrosis factor-a levels. Moreover, they significantly (P < 0.05) increased plasma fasting insulin, C-peptide, adiponectin, pancreatic IL-2, catalase, superoxide dismutase, glutathione peroxidase, and reduced glutathione when contrasted with diabetic control rats. Furthermore, they prevented extensive histopathological damage in the pancreas of diabetic rats. ConclusionsParicalcitol reduced pancreatic oxidative stress and inflammatory markers, and improved glycemic status in diabetic rats.

SN Insights: Use Cases & Product Model

Key customers - external

User	Use case examples
Institutions (Libraries / Universities)	 Understanding how Springer Nature content feeds into an institute's patent pipeline & the awarding of grants A measure of the value an institution gets out of the subscriptions they have
Corporations	 Understanding how SN content contributes to the commercialisation of research output, in particular the granting of patents and creation of drug pipelines
Government	 Where researchers are publishing and whether or not we see benefits in OA, high impact titles (i.e. the Nature collection) etc Changing trends in publication that can be seen from the SN landscape
Funders	 Understand where awardees are publishing, especially in the higher impact journals or Open Access titles



Key customers - external

User	Use case examples
Researchers	 Measure impact, how and where an academic's work has been most effective Get key insights into Springer Nature journals, to help choose where to submit
Societies	 Understand how research areas are changing over time to inform society strategy Analyse journal/book performance to drive the creation of spin off titles
Editors in Chief	 Access statistics for their publication, to understand how it has been performing over time and to compare with top competitors Check if their publication is properly indexed in Web of Science, Scopus, Compendex, Google Scholar etc.



External Product Model = Freemium Approach

Free product:

- The full offering of SN data **limited to publications** from 2016 and older*
- Taking the **Green Open Access** model that customers are familiar with, and applying the same logic (i.e. 12-18 month embargo to the most recent content)
- Ring fenced with the same content **limitations as the Dimensions free version**



Paid-for product:

- All Springer Nature publications, updated weekly
- All patent, grant and clinical trials
 within Dimensions that relates to that
 content
- Includes proprietary Springer Nature data, e.g. downloads & denials, entitlements
