


Lost in translation

Statistics



In France, **7% of the active population** is functionally illiterate. They are mostly men, half of them older than 45 years old. More than the half of this 2 500 000 persons have a professional activity. France is **an immigration country**. According to the ONU definition (2010), France has 7.1 millions d'immigrates, that is 11,1% of the population.



Actions and national plans



The law regarding the territorial public service has integrated literacy in life long training programs goals

- Functional illiteracy as Prior national cause in 2013
- The Territory-Reading contracts allow to define actions and their
- corresponding financial modes, and to engage partners
- **Regional plans against functional illiteracy**
- Several agency, mostly for immigrants (ANLCI, OFII (CAI))





The Bibliothèque publique d'information is frequented by migrants from various parts of the world, some of them seeking for asylum




