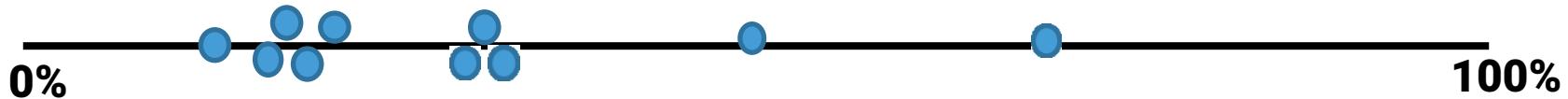

# Motivation für Altmetrics-Einsatz in Repositorien



opening the user's/researcher's mind to think in a different way of citations

visibility

make the real value of repository content more transparent

finding ways to know how articles are accessed

reflecting a wide spectrum of use and impact

to make the repository more attractive

to identify „hot topics“

insight in scientific communication outside of scientific journals

to see the real impact of a publication in a repository

citizens' involvement in publishing content (OA)

to acknowledge the ambiguity of metrics and impact

to get rid of the JIF one day

as a complement/alternative to the JIF

could reflect the interactions of different audiences with the research object from different geographical locations and in real time

# Barrieren für Altmetrics-Einsatz in Repositorien



interpretation (no one knows what it really means, we can't even agree on what „impact“ is)

no „real“ social reason to implement an alternative to the JIF

quality of data

noise

lack of support from management (compared to JIF)

reliability of data

lack of interfaces

accessibility

data collection

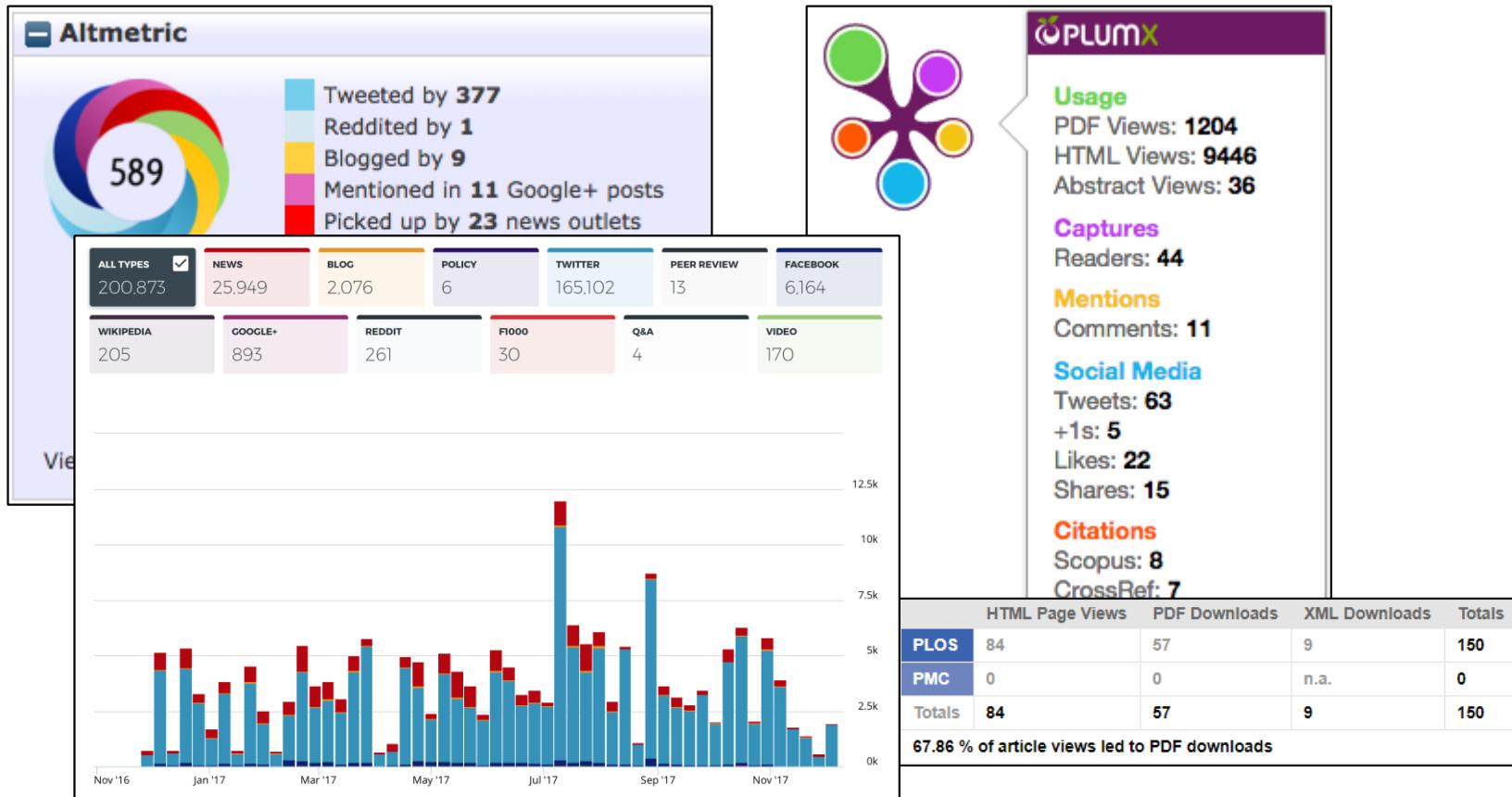

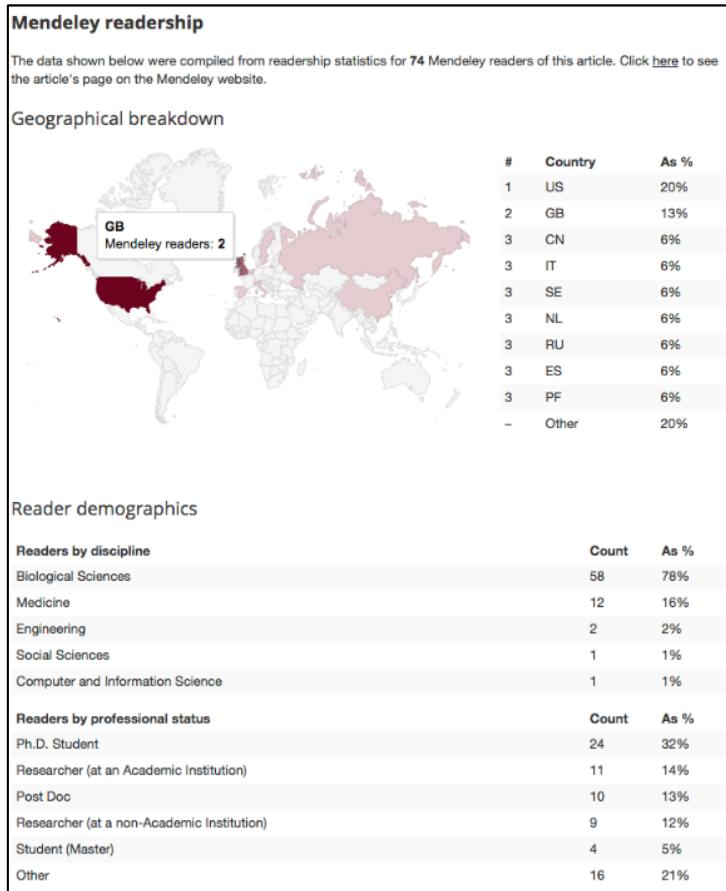

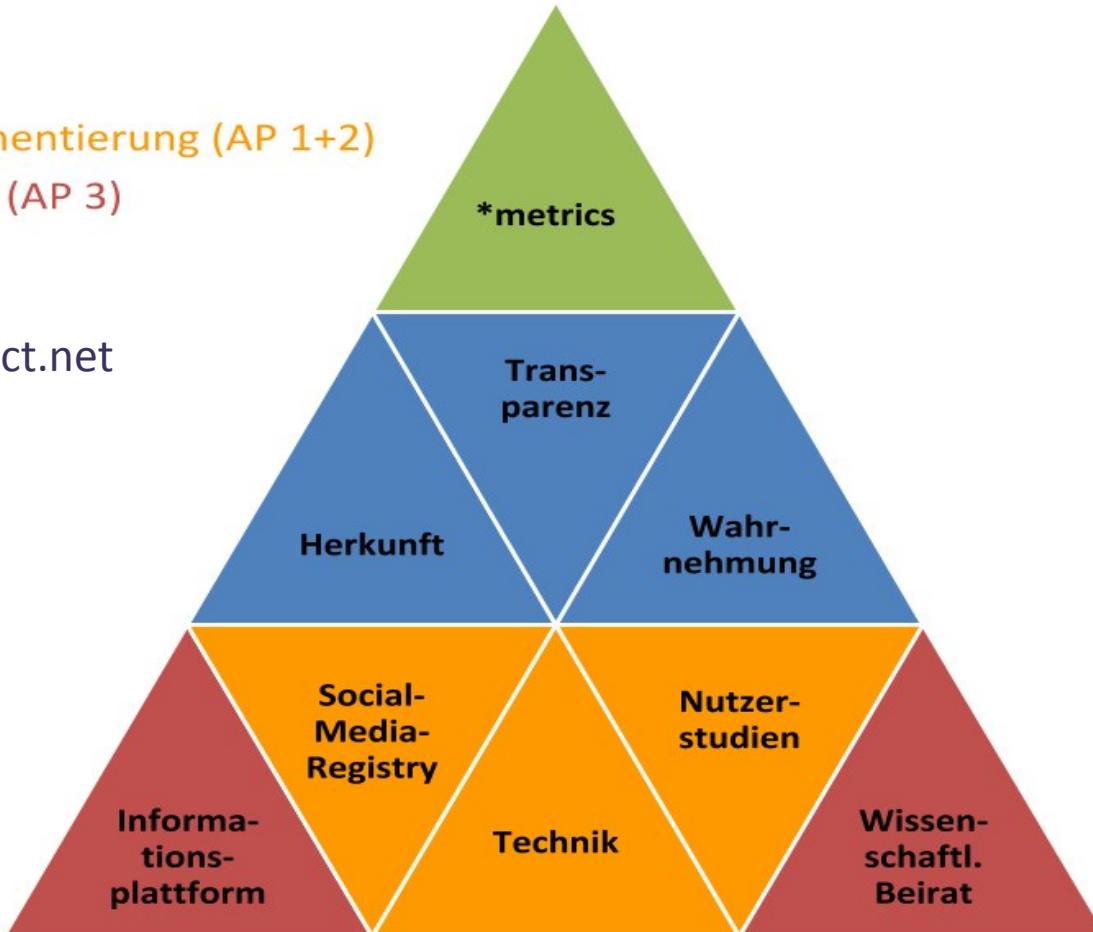
