(ACRL 2000)

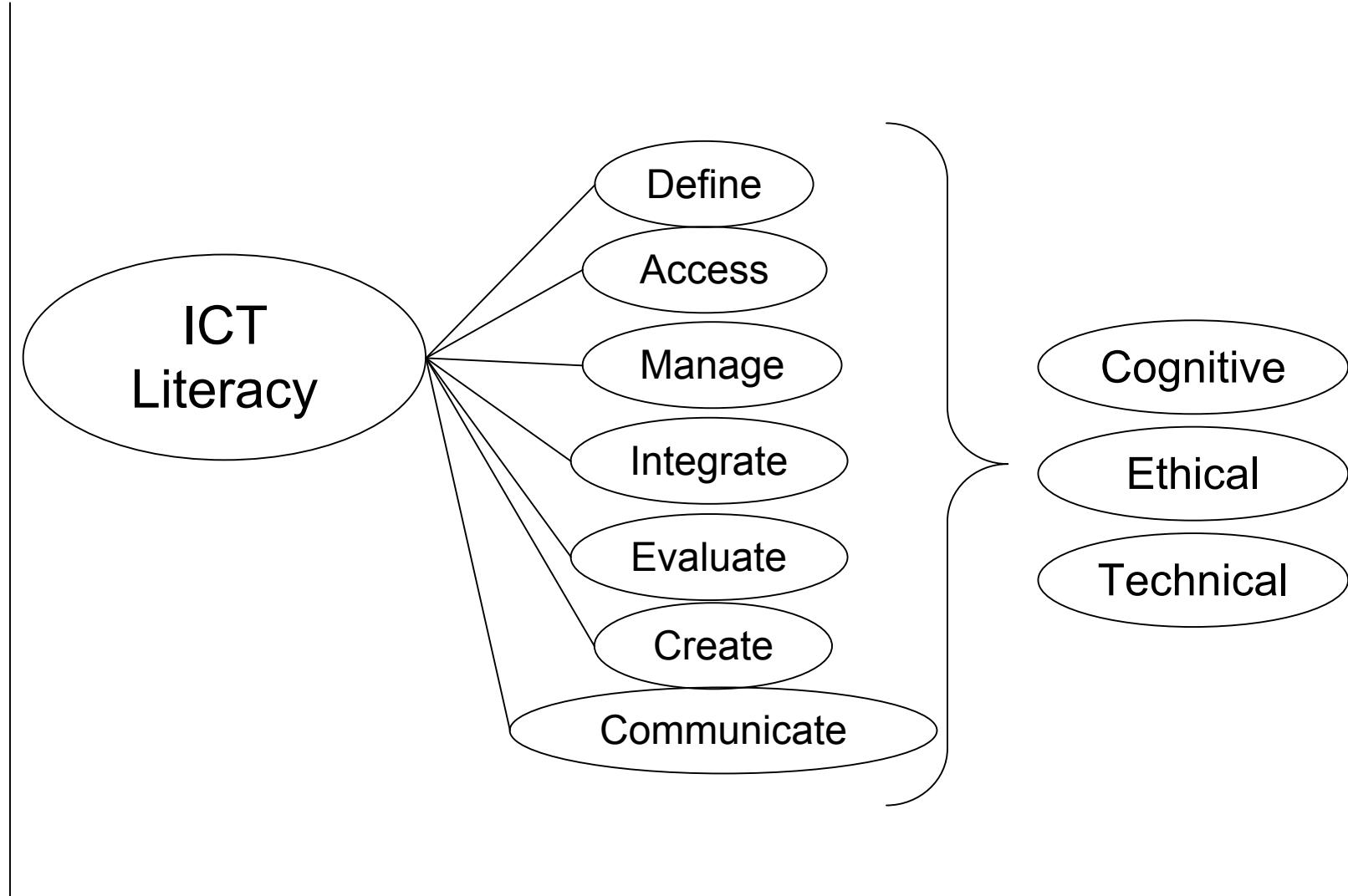
Definition:

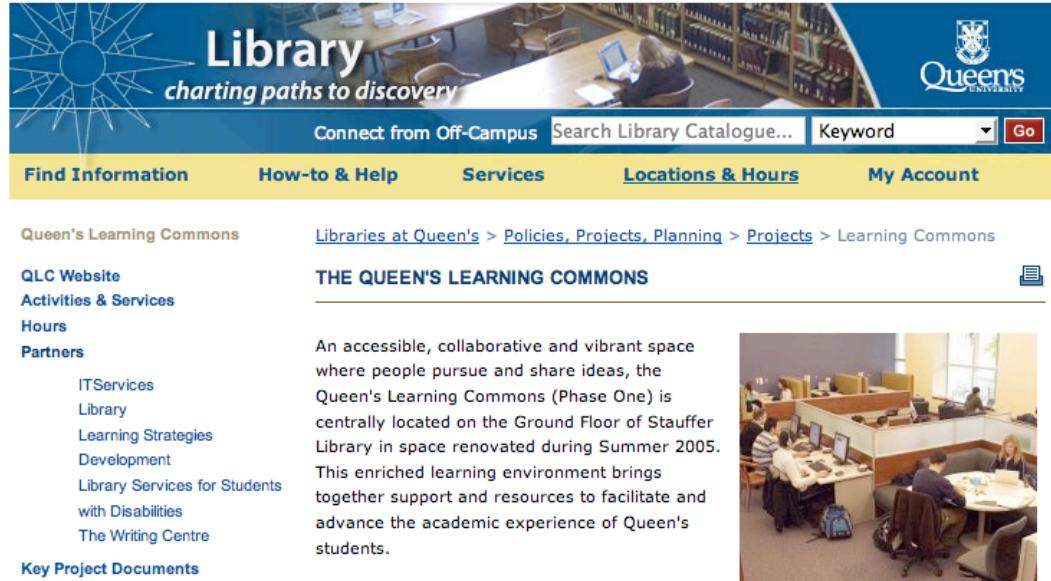

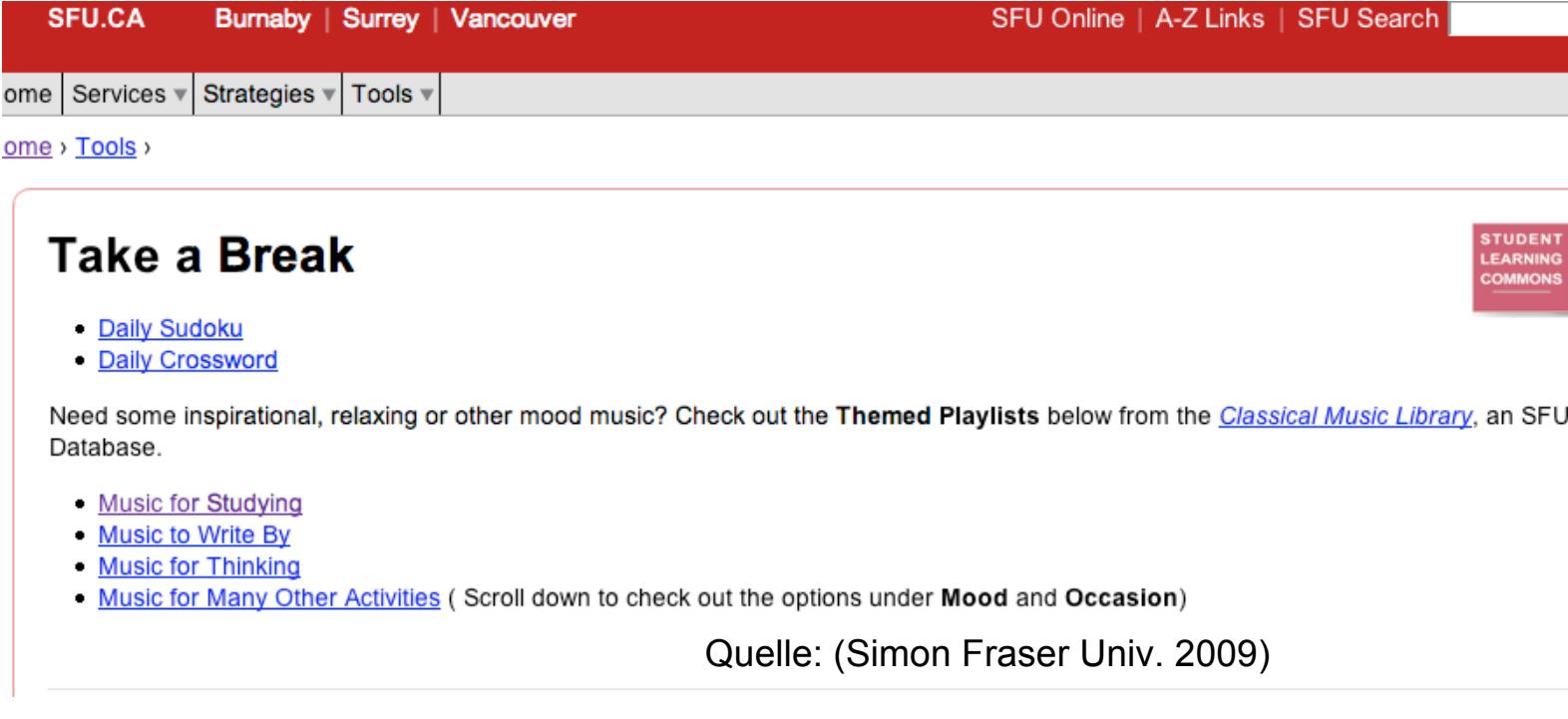
