Incubation of both electrodes with 30 μ M PSI (100 mM PPB pH 7) and 1 mM cyt *c* (5 mM PPB pH 7) for 3 min each.



Figure S3: Comparison of mean value (black squares) and standard deviation (error bars) of the photocurrent of photobioelectrodes prepared with two different protein immobilization processes measured with 3 and 4 electrodes, respectively. (I) sequential incubation of the 3D rGO electrode with first 30 μ M PSI (100 mM PPB pH 7), then 1 mM cyt *c* (5 mM PPB pH 7) for 3 min each; (II) incubation with a mixture containing 15 μ M PSI and 0.5 mM cyt *c* (50 mM PPB pH 7) for 3 min. The photocurrent was measured at -0.15 V vs. Ag/AgCl in 5 mM PBB pH 7.
