Preface

The past academic year has been a successful one for the Chair of Services Marketing, advancing in scholarly research, contributing towards several academic programs, and serving the institution by assuming relevant administrative tasks. The chair has been able to secure a new doctoral assistant, Christian Troebs, who maintains a specific interest in the Chair's new research direction concentrating on the topic of frontline marketing. Efforts continue to push this new research interest and first research results on frontline marketing were already presented at this year's competitive Frontiers in Service conference. To grow focused expertise in relevant research methodologies for this line of work, an in-depths seminar on hierarchical linear modeling by the Society for Research on Educational Effectiveness (SREE) was attended by the chair holder. Since frontline marketing and the particular issue of emotional labor are also subject to organizational theory, the Chair is also expanding an expertise in the respective contemporary management literature, which will serve as an additional type of publication outlet for the current work.

The chair provided effective teaching experiences in the Part-Time MBA, Full-Time MBA, MSc, MLB and BSc programs. The underlying teaching philosophy centers on the issues of interactivity and depth. Lectures are characterized by engaging classroom discussions. Not the quantity of content conveyed is maximized but a thorough understanding of the material including its underlying theoretical dispositions, potential boundary conditions, and applicability is attempted to be facilitated. This approach tends to be well perceived by the students.

Acknowledging its role as part of an intertwined social community, the Chair continues to assume substantial responsibilities that advance the institution. Such engagements include serving on the ethics committee, chairing the examination board for the MSc program, and membership in the school's senate.

Interactive lectures, invited guest speakers, and case study activities provided an overview of the elements of contemporary marketing communication and the underlying guiding principles shaping its deployment.

Foundations of Marketing [2 SWS]

This course revolved around the recognition that successful marketing is based on creating and conveying a distinct value proposition that is appealing to the respective target customers. The class elaborated on this idea, introducing fundamental concepts, tools, and frameworks of contemporary marketing in combination with industry examples. A broad range of marketing issues in varying industry contexts and service environments were covered. Key topics included consumer behavior and decision making, market segmentation, product positioning, customer touchpoints, and elements of marketing communication.
