







Professor Fülbier studied at the Bochum University (Habilitation), Münster University (PhD), TU Sofia, USW-ESMT and Cologne University. He worked as a scientific expert in international accounting, consulting projects in IAS/IFRS or US-GAAP accounting, executive development programs for well-known companies and organisations. He also worked for the Deutsche Bank AG (Apprenticeship/Fellowship program).

Professor Fülbier won WHU's Best Teaching Award, the Visiting Scholar Oxford University Award and the Said Business School Award. He also won the Ernst&Young-Stiftung e.V. scholarship, the Münster University Award for the thesis on "Regulierung der Ad-hoc Publizität".

Professor Schäffer studied business administration at WHU - Otto Beisheim School of Management in Vallendar, as well as at the EM Lyon and the Kellogg Graduate School of Management in Chicago. In 1996, he received his doctorate at the Chair of Controlling and Telecommunications of Professor Jürgen Weber. In 2001, he qualified as a university professor at WHU and was the first executive director of the Center for Controlling & Management (CCM). In 2002, he accepted the Chair for Business Administration, particularly Management Accounting and Control, at the European Business School in Oestrich-Winkel. In addition to his professorship, Utz Schäffer also held the academic position of associate dean for research as well as the chairmanship of the doctoral committee from 2003 to 2007. In the same year, he accepted the offer of a Chair of Business Administration, particularly Management Accounting and Control at WHU. He declined a chair at the Technische Universität Braunschweig (Controlling and Financial Accounting).

Utz Schäffer is coeditor of the Zeitschrift für Controlling und Management (ZfCM). Short Biography

Dr. Thorsten Sellhorn, MBA, was appointed to the Chair of Accounting at WHU – Otto Beisheim School of Management in September 2008. He holds a Dr. rer. oec. (equivalent to Ph.D.) degree in Economics and Business Administration from Ruhr-Universität Bochum. As a scholar of the Fulbright program and of the German National Academic Foundation, he obtained an MBA degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (USA). Short Biography

Professor Weber studied Business Administration at the University of Göttingen and graduated there in 1978. Subsequently, he gained a doctorate in 1981 under Wolfgang Männel at the University of Dortmund. In 1982 he moved with his Ph. D. supervisor to the University of Erlangen-Nuremberg, where he became a professor in mid-1986.

In the same year he took over the chair as University Professor for Business Administration, in particular Financial Accounting and Management Accounting at the WHU – Otto Beisheim School of Management. Besides being the chair of Chair of Management Accounting & Control I his academic responsibilities comprise leading the Center for Controlling and Management and the Kuehne-Center for Logistics Management as well as co-leading the Institute for Management and Controlling. He also manages the academic program of the Diplom.

Professor Weber accepted positions as visiting professor at the University of Vienna (summer semester 1990) and the Vienna University of Economics and Business Administration (winter semester 1999/2000). He belongs to the German Academic Association for Business Research (Verband der Hochschullehrer für Betriebswirtschaft e.V.) as well as various academic commissions of the Association, and is acting director and co-editor of the Journal for Management and Management Accounting (Zeitschrift für Controlling und Management, ZfCM). He has declined positions at the University of Mainz (Logistics), the Vienna University of Economics and Business Administration (Management Accounting and Corporate Governance) and the Technical University in Darmstadt (Accounting and Controlling).

Upon graduating with a Master's Degree in Finance (summa cum laude) in November 2003, she progressed on an academic path as a PhD student and research assistant at the Swiss Banking Institute, University of Zurich. 

Professor Schweizer studied business administration at the Johann-Wolfgang-Goethe University in Frankfurt am Main, Germany. After graduating, Professor Schweizer began his dissertation at the Endowed Chair for Asset Management at the European Business School (EBS) in Oestrich-Winkel, Germany. He successfully completed his PhD in April 2008 with the thesis "Selected Essays on Alternative Investments." At the same time, Professor Schweizer worked as an academic assistant in the design and structuring of executive educational programmes in alternative investments and finance at the PFI Private Finance Institute/EBS Finanzakademie in Oestrich-Winkel. Professor Schweizer also lectured in those programs.

The main research focus of the assistant professorship is twofold: 1) to compare the profitability of alternative investments for institutional investors, and 2) to evaluate the approaches and investment strategies of hedge fund and private equity managers. During this process, the assistant professor for alternative investments will also analyze whether those managers are capable of increasing investor wealth, and whether the appreciation is significant and sustainable. Further areas of particular interest for this assistant professorship are: detecting and analyzing the success determinants of investment strategies and the influencing factors for target companies and their rivals, and studying new investment vehicles such as Special Purpose Acquisition Companies (SPACs), a subgroup of private equity that utilizes new incentive structures.



Short Biography

Professor Spinler received a Master's degree in Electrical Engineering from Friedrich-Alexander University in Erlangen. During his studies, he completed a thesis at University College London (UK) and a diploma thesis at the renowned Bell Labs in Murray Hill, NJ, U.S.A. He is a fellow of both the German Scholarship Foundation and the Bavarian Foundation for Gifted Students. In May 1997, he was awarded the diploma in Electrical Engineering. Subsequently, he joined Infineon Technologies, formerly Siemens Semiconductor, as a lead engineer in process integration.

From October 1999 to August 2002, Professor Spinler was a doctoral student in the department of Production Management and taught at WHU and Leipzig Graduate School of Management (HHL). His research on options on capacity has been presented at international conferences and leading US Business Schools. Moreover, his research was awarded a number of prizes, most notably the Management Science Strategic Innovation Award (from EURO) as well as the GOR dissertation award.

Despite the acceptance of Management Accounting/
Controlling today, shortcomings can be observed in theory
and practice in equal measures. For controllers within businesses, competition is building from, amongst others, internal
consultants, or – as accounting is increasingly unified – from
accountants. This development often hits those responsible
for management accounting unprepared: they rarely have a
knowledge of internal competitive strategy, or transparency
of their own core competencies, or simply a precise knowledge of their clients. In turn, at universities, the most widely
developed theoretical deliberations on controlling are becoming increasingly distant from reality. This hinders opportunities to falsify theoretical hypotheses, and likewise the incorporation of practical knowledge into theory bulding.

Faced with this, it is necessary to find a new basis for the conjunction of theory and practice. The Center for Controlling and Management (CCM) at the WHU – Otto Beisheim School of Management – was founded for this purpose. Here, under the leadership of Prof. Jürgen Weber, holder of the Chair of Management Accounting and Control I, a limited number of businesses cooperate closely for a pre-defined time period with the following objectives: to accelerate the implementation process of new knowledge, to exchange extensive and systematic operating experience, to gain new scientific insights, as well as to integrate the controlling community.

The Kuehne-Center for Logistics Management was founded in October 2000. It has established a very strong position as a platform for developing and exchanging logistics and supply chain management knowledge in strong cooperation between corporate practice and academic research.

Research activities focus on the fields "Management of Logistics Service Providers" and "Supply Chain Management". In close cooperation with corporate partners, research questions in these focus areas are analyzed and applied to solve practical problems.
