





WHU Foundation

Established in 1984, the WHU Foundation is a

charitable foundation registered under German law in Vallendar, Germany. Its main purpose is to fund and support WHU - Otto Beisheim School of Management, one of Germany's leading business schools. The Foundation's activities are financed by its capital and third-party donations.

The Executive Board is responsible for the efficient and effective management of the Foundation's business. It ensures that WHU properly fulfills its obligations and maintains

its aims. One of the primary duties of the Executive Board is to increase the assets of the Foundation to ensure the sustainable development of WHU. The WHU organizational structure can be divided






Academic Programs


The Kellogg-WHU Executive MBA Program unites





Diversity & Internationalization


In recent years, diversity has gained








Strengthening WHU's Entrepreneurial Ecosystem


Student life at WHU is not just about studying




Alumni Activities – In Praxi Alumni Association




